#### **PETITION**

#### **PURPOSE AND JUSTIFICATION**

Lots 225 and 63 have been in commercial use for over 50 years. Lots 91 and 64 were undesirably split by the residential/commercial zone line in 1973. There are two lawsuits pending in the Land Court between the owner of lots 63, 91, and 64 and the Town to determine the location of the zone line on all of these lots. It is the purpose of this Article together with a permanent deed restriction to settle the Land Court cases by including all of the four lots in the C-30 district and to protect the residential neighborhood on Old Post Road with no access and a landscaped screening buffer along Old Post Road on lots 63, 91 and 64.

**ARTICLE 10 ZONING BY-LAW DEFINITION CHANGE / SIGN, ANIMATED PLANNING BOARD**

To see if the town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Laws, Section IX, B. Selected Words and Terms, by deleting in its entirety the existing definition and replacing it with the following definition to read as follows:

Sign, Animated: A sign which includes flashing, action, motion and non-motion whether electronic action, mechanical action, or computer generated color or message change by way of pre-arranged electronic, mechanical, or computer means. Signs that use alternative means of power including but not limited to solar and wind are considered electric.

In the Zoning By-Law, Section VI Supplementary Regulations, G. Signs, 2. General Sign Regulations, d, refers to animated signs and that they are prohibited. However, the existing definition is convoluted and can be easily manipulated. By clarifying this, the Zoning Enforcement Agent will be able to clearly apply the Sign Bylaws and will be consistent with the intent of the Bylaw.

**ARTICLE 11 ZONING BY-LAW DEFINITION CHANGE  
SIGN, CHANGEABLE**

**PLANNING BOARD**

To see if the town will vote to vote to amend the Zoning By-Laws, Section IX, B. Selected Words and Terms, by deleting in its entirety the existing definition:

**Sign, Changeable.** A sign whose informational content can be changed or altered by manual or electric, eletro-mechanical or electronic means. Changeable signs include the following types:

1. **Manually Activated:** signs whose alphabetic, picto-graphic, or symbolic informational content can be changed or altered by manual means.

2. **Electrically Activated:** Signs whose alphabetic, picto-graphic, or symbolic informational content can be changed or altered on a fixed display surface composed of electrically illuminated or mechanically driven changeable segments. Includes the following two types:
  - a. **Fixed Message Electronic Signs:** Signs whose basic informational content has been pre-programmed to include only certain types of information projection, such as time, temperature, predictable traffic conditions, or other events subject to prior programming.
  - b. **Computer Controlled Variable Message Electronic Signs:** Signs whose informational content can be changed or altered by means of computer-driven electronic impulses.

This definition is only referred to in the existing animated sign definition. By leaving this definition in without any referral within the bylaw, will in essence allow for this type of signage.

To see if the town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Laws, Section VI.G. Signs, 2. General Sign Regulations part d, by removing the strike through portion and adding the underlined text to read as follows:

- d. A sign (including temporary interior window displays or banners) or its illuminator shall not by reason of its location, shape, size or color interfere with traffic or be confused with or obstruct the view of the effectiveness of any official traffic sign, traffic signal, or traffic marking. Therefore, animated signs are not permitted, ~~and~~ Red, yellow or green colored exterior or interior lights lightings shall not be allowed.

Exception: Banks and Gas Stations may have numerical signs stating the price, time and temperature by way of special permit through the Zoning Board of Appeals as long as it complies with the above mentioned regulation and all other applicable regulations.

**ARTICLE XIV. JUNK DEALERS - FLEA MARKETS****Section 1.**

No person shall engage in the purchase, sale or barter of junk, old metals or second-hand articles without having obtained therefor a license issued by the Board of Selectmen.

**Section 2.**

a. Every keeper of a shop for the purchase, sale or barter of junk, old metal or second-hand articles shall keep a book in which will be written at the time of each purchase of any article, a description thereof, the name, age, and residence of the person from whom purchased, and the day and hour when such purchase was made. Such book shall be at all times open to the inspection of the Chief of Police or any person by him authorized to make such inspection.

b. Every keeper of such shop shall put in a suitable and conspicuous place of his shop a sign having his name and occupation legibly inscribed thereon in large letters. Such shop and all articles of merchandise therein may be at all times examined by the Chief of Police or by any police officer by him authorized to make such inspection.

c. No keeper of such shop and no junk collector shall, directly or indirectly, either purchase or receive by way of barter or exchange, any of the articles aforesaid, of a minor or apprentice, knowing or having reason to believe him to be such.

d. No article purchased or received by such shopkeeper shall be sold until at least one week from the date of its purchase or receipt has elapsed.

e. Such shop shall be closed between the hours of 6 PM and 7 AM, and no keeper thereof and no junk collector shall purchase any of the articles aforesaid during such hours.

**Section 3.**

All persons conducting antique sales or bazaars commonly referred to as "Flea Markets" shall be licensed by the Board of Selectmen. Residents will be permitted to hold one yard sale of household articles, not to exceed three consecutive days, during each calendar year without a license, any subsequent yard sale during that calendar year shall require a special permit or license and be approved by the Board of Selectmen. A fee of two dollars (\$2.00) is hereby charged for such license obtained. Civic, religious and fraternal organizations shall be exempt from the fee.

**Section 4.**

a. Any person or persons who shall receive a fee, for the conducting of a sale upon property owned by them, from persons to sell their goods at said sale, shall be deemed a

commercial enterprise and shall require a license and be approved by the Board of Selectmen. A fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) is hereby charged for said annual license. All civic, religious and fraternal organizations shall be exempt from that fee.

- b. All signs used to advertise a sale shall be removed within twenty-four (24) hours after completion of the sale.
- c. All sales shall be conducted during the hours specified by the licensing authority.
- d. This Section shall be enforced by the North Attleborough Police Department. It shall be the duty of said department to investigate any violation of this section coming to their attention.

#### CHAPTER 31. CIVIL SERVICE

##### Chapter 31: Section 58A. Municipal police officers and firefighters; maximum age restrictions

Section 58A. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, in any city, town or district that accepts this section, no person shall be eligible to have his name certified for original appointment to the position of firefighter or police officer if such person has reached his thirty-second birthday on the date of the entrance examination. Any veteran shall be allowed to exceed the maximum age provision of this section by the number of years served on active military duty, but in no case shall said candidate for appointment be credited more than four years of active military duty.
