- e. **Compost Center Is Now Open to North Attleborough Residents:**
Composting Facility Hours (excluding holidays) are as follows:
 -  **Friday: 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.**
 -  **Saturday: 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.**
 -  **Sunday: 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.**
- f. **2025 Curbside Yard Waste Collection:** Spring 2025 yard waste collection will take place April 7–11, April 21–25, and April 28–May 2 on residents’ regular trash day. Yard waste must be placed curbside by 7:00 AM and is collected by a separate truck. You may set out up to 14 bags per day, each weighing no more than 50 lbs. - g. **Spring 2025 DPW Projects:** Starting April 7, 2025, several construction projects began around town. Roadway maintenance began on Eddy Street and will continue through June. Expect detours and delays. Liberty Utilities will replace gas mains on Park St., North Washington St., and Summer St., causing occasional detours. On Chestnut St., drainage and sidewalk work will begin between Route 1 and Elm St., continuing to Mt. Hope, with local traffic access, temporary “No Parking” signs, and an expected duration of 2–3 months. Visit nattleboro.com for detour maps and updates.
- h. **Dog Licenses:** Dog licenses are available in the Town Clerk’s Office for \$10 (spayed/neutered) or \$20 (male/female). A \$25 late fee per dog will apply after April 30, 2025.

North Attleborough Launches Opioid Impact Community Survey to Gather Input on Settlement Fund Usage

NORTH ATTLEBOROUGH, MA--- Town Manager Michael Borg and Director & Public Health Nurse Anne Marie Fleming encourage community members to share their input on how the Town of North Attleborough should spend opioid settlement funds via the Opioid Impact Community Survey.

The Town of North Attleborough has launched its [Opioid Impact Community Survey](#) today. The survey can be accessed on the town's website under the Health Department. It should take less than 10 minutes for community members to complete and includes six multiple-choice and short-answer questions seeking ideas for how the town should use its opioid settlement funds.

All responses are anonymous except those interested in participating in a focus group regarding opioid crisis interventions. Those interested in participating in the focus group will be asked to share their name and email address. Those who wish to share only their feedback will not have to provide any contact details.

The deadline for community members to respond to the survey is Friday, May 2.

As of February 2025, the Town of North Attleborough has received \$735,000 in opioid abatement funds. These funds are part of a larger, statewide settlement to municipalities across the Commonwealth, which will allocate over \$900 million over the next 10-plus years. The funds are directly from opioid distributors and pharmacies that have directly or indirectly contributed to the opioid epidemic. Towns can use settlement funds to support prevention, harm reduction, treatment and recovery services. Over the next 14 years, the Town of North Attleborough is projected to receive \$1,716,791.24, with an average annual distribution of \$122,627.

Municipalities that receive opioid settlement funds must solicit feedback from community members on how to spend the funds. Under the guidance of North Attleborough's Opioid Task Force, the survey will

be used to guide future initiatives and programming. The Opioid Task Force has collaborated with the Health Department and School Department to offer INTERFACE Referral Services, an outpatient mental health resource and referral helpline. The task force is also looking to hire a co-response mental health clinician for the North Attleboro Police Department.


